Research and teaching at the Institute for IS & Society focuses on human-centric, social, wellbeingoriented, value-based information systems. We seek to contribute to more ethical IT innovation and sustainable IT design methods, especially with a view to AI. We study not only technology but also the psychological and philosophical dimensions of human – machine co-evolution.

The career path to full professorship is based on a qualification agreement (QA). This QA can be agreed after an initial contract duration of two years (§ 27 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement). Pursuant to WU's Personnel Development Plan, the position as Assistant Professor is then fixed for up to six years. Upon reaching the QA objectives, employment can be made permanent. Employees who have successfully completed their QA are classified as Associate Professors (from an organizational regulation perspective they belong to the group of professors). Three years after this successful QA completion, they are entitled to apply for promotion to full professor according to the By-Laws of WU § 43a.
